The public is encouraged to attend Thursday's open house and be directly engaged in the development of the city's comprehensive plan. The open house will allow for constructive discussion of issues such as the development of policies for future land use, community, economic development, the environment and transportation.

"The open house is intended to encourage a community-wide involvement in defining the

direction for the future of Branson over the next two decades," said Planning and Development Director Jim Lawson.
